

COMMANDERS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: What are the annual training requirements for Substance Abuse Prevention Education?

A: For AGR Service Members, they must have 4 hours annually. For M-Day Service Members, they are to have 2 hours annually. All training must be uploaded into DAMIS for ARNG and Sign in rosters sent to the Alcohol & Drug Control Officer (ADCO).

Q: How can new Service Members receive information regarding Substance Abuse Prevention?

A: Provide them with a Newcomers Briefing during Unit orientation; one is provided on the Counterdrug website. Also, a request can be done to have the ADCO or the Prevention Coordinator (PC) come and provide one to a group.

Q: I have several SMs that have come up positive for illegal drugs. How can I get my Unit prevention training?

A: There are several ways. Your UPLs can give prevention training. Briefings are provided on our Counterdrug website. You can request the ADCO or PC come and give a briefing to the Unit.

Q: I have a SM that self referred for drugs. What should I do?

A: YOU MUST NOTIFY THE ADCO or PC OF ALL SELF REFERRALS. Make sure you and the SM review and understand the Limited Use Policy. **Contact the ADCO or PC for assistance with the packet** and on setting up treatment for the SM. During the counseling of the SM have them sign a release of consent form to you and the ADCO/PC.

Q: Can a SM go to any treatment center to get his/her assessment done?

A: NO! It must be done by a State Certified Facility, or at one of the Active Duty Military installations. Contact the ADCO or PC for assistance on finding the best facility for your SMs. You can go to the link on the Counterdrug website for the Treatment Facility locator. Enter the hometown of the SM and it will provide a list of facilities.
